Aspects of Sardis at the time of Revelation

J	Regional capital of Lydia in Asia Minor.
J	Its mountaintop Acropolis was famous for being impregnable.
J	Twice subject to surprise attacks: by the Persian, Cyrus and Alexander the Great.
J	Refounded by Seleucids after Persian destruction.
J	By the time of Revelation, it was the center of the imperia cult in Lydia and a rival of Smyrna and Ephesus
J	Lydian wealth was legendary, based on the gold in the River Pactolus, back to King Croesus (6 th century BCE)
J	Rebuilt after major earthquake in 17 CE with imperial aid, leading to many major monumental structures and repairs, such as
	 the Metroon (Temple to Cybele, originally built in the Persian period)
	 Artemision (Temple to Artemis, originally built in the Seleucid period after Alexander the Great)
	 Bath-gymnasium complex (built in the late 1st/early 2nd centuries CE, and later held a Jewish syna-gogue)
J	Population estimated at 60-100,000
J	Focus of wool clothing and carpet industries
