

Luke's summary statements

IN THE GOSPEL:	
1.80	The child [John] grew and became strong in spirit, and he was in the wilderness until the day he appeared publicly to Israel
2.40	The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.
2.52	And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favor.
4.44	So he continued proclaiming the message in the synagogues of Judea.
7.21	Jesus had just then cured many people of diseases, plagues, and evil spirits, and had given sight to many who were blind.
8.1-3	Soon afterwards he went on through cities and villages, proclaiming and bringing the good news of the kingdom of God. The twelve were with him, as well as some women who had been cured of evil spirits and infirmities: Mary, called Magdalene, from whom seven demons had gone out, and Joanna, the wife of Herod's steward Chuza, and Susanna, and many others, who provided for them out of their resources.
13.22	Jesus went through one town and village after another, teaching as he made his way to Jerusalem.
18.34	But they understood nothing about all these things; in fact, what he said was hidden from them, and they did not grasp what was said.
19.47-48	Every day he was teaching in the temple. The chief priests, the scribes, and the leaders of the people kept looking for a way to kill him; but they did not find anything they could do, for all the people were spellbound by what they heard.
21.37	Every day he was teaching in the temple, and at night he would go out and spend the night on the Mount of Olives, as it was called.
24.17	Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them the things about himself in all the scriptures.

IN ACTS OF THE APOSTLES:

2.42-47 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

4.32-35 Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. With great power the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. There was not a needy person among them, for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold. They laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need.

12.24 ...the word of God continued to advance and gain adherents.

16.4-5 As they went from town to town, they delivered to them for observance the decisions that had been reached by the apostles and elders who were in Jerusalem. So the churches were strengthened in the faith and increased in numbers daily.

18.4 Every sabbath he [Paul] would argue in the synagogue and would try to convince Jews and Greeks.

18.23 After spending some time there he [Paul] departed and went from place to place through the region of Galatia and Phrygia, strengthening all the disciples.

19.18-19 ...many of those who became believers confessed and disclosed their practices. A number of those who practiced magic collected their books and burned them publicly...

19.20 So the word of the Lord grew mightily and prevailed.

28.30-31 He [Paul] lived there [in Rome] two whole years at his own expense and welcomed all who came to him, proclaiming the kingdom of God and teaching about the Lord Jesus Christ with all boldness and without hindrance.
