

Deuteronomy in Luke's temptation narrative

LUKE	EXODUS/DEUTERONOMY
Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness	These are the words that Moses spoke to all Israel beyond the Jordan--in the wilderness (1.1) and in the wilderness, where you saw how YHWH your God carried you , just as one carries a child (1.31) Remember the long way that YHWH your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness, in order to humble you, testing you to know what was in your heart, whether or not you would keep his commandments. (8.2)
where for forty days he was tempted by the devil.	I [Moses] remained on the mountain forty days and forty nights (9.9) Then I lay prostrate before YHWH as before, forty days and forty nights (9.18)
He ate nothing at all during those days , and when they were over, he was famished.	I neither ate bread nor drank water. (9.9, 18)
The devil said to him, " If you are the Son of God...	[Then you shall say to Pharaoh, 'Thus says YHWH: Israel is my firstborn son. (Ex 4.22)]
...command this stone to become a loaf of bread."	
Jesus answered him, " It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone.' "	This entire commandment that I command you today you must diligently observe, so that you may live.... (8.1) He humbled you by letting you hunger, then by feeding you with manna, with which neither you nor your ancestors were acquainted, in order to make you understand that one does not live by bread alone , but by every word that comes from the mouth of YHWH. (8.3)
Then the devil led him up and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. And the devil said to him, "To you I will give their glory and all this authority; for it has been given over to me, and I give it to anyone I please.	Then Moses went up from the plains of Moab to Mount Nebo , to the top of Pisgah, which is opposite Jericho, and YHWH showed him the whole land: Gilead as far as Dan, all Naphtali, the land of Ephraim and Manasseh, all the land of Judah as far as the Western Sea, the Negeb, and the Plain--that is, the valley of Jericho, the city of palm trees--as far as Zoar. YHWH said to him, "This is the land of which I swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, saying, 'I will give it to your descendants'" (34.1-4)
If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours." Jesus answered him, " It is written, 'Worship YHWH your God, and serve only him.' "	YHWH your God you shall fear; him you shall serve, and by his name alone you shall swear. (6.13)
Then the devil took him to Jerusalem, and placed him on the pinnacle of the temple, saying to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written, 'He will command his angels concerning you, to protect you,' and 'On their hands they will bear you up, so that you will not dash your foot against a stone.'"	[Psalm 91 is the echo here]
Jesus answered him, " It is said, 'Do not put YHWH your God to the test.' "	Do not put YHWH your God to the test , as you tested him at Mas-sah. (6.16)
