

Imprisonment in Luke/Acts [not including “arrests” or related words]

LUKE	
3.20	[Herod] added to all [the evil he had done] by shutting up John in prison .
12.58	Thus, when you go with your accuser before a magistrate, on the way make an effort to settle the case, or you may be dragged before the judge, and the judge hand you over to the officer, and the officer throw you in prison .
21.12-13	"But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons , and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. This will give you an opportunity to testify.
22.33	[Peter] said to him, "Lord, I am ready to go with you to prison and to death!"
ACTS	
5.17-18	Then the high priest took action; he and all who were with him (that is, the sect of the Sadducees), being filled with jealousy, arrested the apostles and put them in the public prison .
8.3	But Saul was ravaging the church by entering house after house; dragging off both men and women, he committed them to prison .
12.4	When [Herod] had seized [Peter], he put him in prison and handed him over to four squads of soldiers to guard him, intending to bring him out to the people after the Passover.
16.23-24	After [the magistrates] had given [Paul and Silas] a severe flogging, they threw them into prison and ordered the jailer to keep them securely. Following these instructions, he put them in the innermost cell and fastened their feet in the stocks.
26.10	And that is what I [Paul] did in Jerusalem; with authority received from the chief priests, I not only locked up many of the saints in prison , but I also cast my vote against them when they were being condemned to death.
