1 SAMUEL	
4.3	Let us bring the ark of the covenant of YHWH here from Shiloh, so that he may come among us and save us from the power of our enemies."
7.8	The people of Israel said to Samuel, "Do not cease to cry out to YHWH our God for us, and pray that he may save us from the hand of the Philistines."
9.16	"Tomorrow about this time I will send to you a man from the land of Benjamin, and you shall anoint him to be ruler over my people Israel. He shall save my people from the hand of the Philistines; for I have seen the suffering of my people, because their outcry has come to me."
10.19	But today you have rejected your God, who saves you from all your calamities and your distresses; and you have said, 'No! but set a king over us.'

17.47	[David to Goliath] that all this assembly may know that YHWH does not save by sword and spear; for the battle is YHWH's and he will give you into our hand."
23.2,	David inquired of YHWH, "Shall I go and attack these Philistines?" YHWH said to David, "Go and attack the Philistines and save Keilah." So David and his men went to Keilah, fought with the Philistines, brought away their livestock, and dealt them a heavy defeat. Thus David saved the inhabitants of Keilah.
25.26, 31, 33	[Abigail to David] Now then, my lord, as YHWH lives, and as you yourself live, since YHWH has saved you from bloodguilt and from taking vengeance with your own hand, now let your enemies and those who seek to do evil to my lord be like Nabalmy lord shall have no cause of grief, or pangs of conscience, for having shed blood without cause or for having saved himself. [David to Abigail] Blessed be your good sense, and blessed be you, who have saved me today from bloodguilt and from avenging myself by my own hand!

2 SAMUEL	
3.18	[Abner to the elders of Israel] YHWH has promised David: Through my servant David I will save my people Israel from the hand of the Philistines, and from all their enemies."
8.6, 14	Then David put garrisons among the Arameans of Damascus; and the Arameans became servants to David and brought tribute. YHWH provided salvation David wherever he wentHe put garrisons in Edom; throughout all Edom he put garrisons, and all the Edomites became David's servants. And YHWH provided salvation to David wherever he went.
10.11	[Joab said to the soldiers], "If the Arameans are too strong for me, then you shall save me; but if the Ammonites are too strong for you, then I will come and save you.
10.19	10:19 When all the kings who were servants of Hadadezer saw that they had been defeated by Israel, they made peace with Israel, and became subject to them. So the Arameans were afraid to save the Ammonites any more.
14.4	When the woman of Tekoa came to the king, she fell on her face to the ground and did obeisance, and said, " Save , O king!"
22.3- 4, 28	[David] my God, my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold and my refuge, my savior; you save me from violence. I call upon YHWH, who is worthy to be praised, and I am saved from my enemies You save a humble people, but your eyes are upon the haughty to bring them down They looked, but there was no one to save them; they cried to YHWH, but he did not answer them.
