## "kingdom" (Greek, basileia) in Luke

- 1:33: He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his **kingdom** there will be no end."
- 4:5: Then the devil led him up and showed him in an instant all the **kingdoms** of the world.
- 4:43: But he said to them, "I must proclaim the good news of the **kingdom of God** to the other cities also; for I was sent for this purpose."
- 6:20: Then he looked up at his disciples and said: "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the **kingdom of God**.
- 7:28: I tell you, among those born of women no one is greater than John; yet the least in the **kingdom of God** is greater than he."
- 8:1: Soon afterwards he went on through cities and villages, proclaiming and bringing the good news of the **kingdom of God**. The twelve were with him,
- 8:10: He said, "To you it has been given to know the secrets of the **kingdom of God**; but to others I speak in parables, so that 'looking they may not perceive, and listening they may not understand.'
- 9:2: and he sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal.
- 9:21: When the crowds found out about it, they followed him; and he welcomed them, and spoke to them about the **king-dom of God**, and healed those who needed to be cured.
- 9:27: But truly I tell you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God."
- 9:60: But Jesus said to him, "Let the dead bury their own dead; but as for you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God."
- 9:62: Jesus said to him, "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God."
- 10:9: cure the sick who are there, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.'
- 10:11: 'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the **kingdom of God** has come near.'
- 11:2: He said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name. Your **kingdom** come.

11:17: But he knew what they were thinking and said to them, "Every **kingdom** divided against itself becomes a desert, and house falls on house.

11:18: If Satan also is divided against himself, how will his **kingdom** stand? --for you say that I cast out the demons by Beelzebul.

- 11:20: But if it is by the finger of God that I cast out the demons, then the **kingdom of God** has come to you.
- 12:31: Instead, strive for his **kingdom**, and these things will be given to you as well.
- 12:32: "Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the **kingdom**.
- 13:28: He said therefore, "What is the **kingdom of God** like? And to what should I compare it?
- 13:20: And again he said, "To what should I compare the **kingdom of God**?
- 13:28: There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the **kingdom of God**, and you yourselves thrown out.
- 13:29: Then people will come from east and west, from north and south, and will eat in the kingdom of God.
- 14:15: One of the dinner guests, on hearing this, said to him, "Blessed is anyone who will eat bread in the kingdom of God!"
- 16:16: "The law and the prophets were in effect until John came; since then the good news of the **kingdom of God** is proclaimed, and everyone tries to enter it by force.
- 17:20: Once Jesus was asked by the Pharisees when the **kingdom of God** was coming, and he answered, "The **kingdom of God** is not coming with things that can be observed;
- 17:21: nor will they say, 'Look, here it is!' or 'There it is!' For, in fact, the **kingdom of God** is among you."
- 18:16: But Jesus called for them and said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the **kingdom of God** belongs.
- 18:17: Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the **kingdom of God** as a little child will never enter it."
- 18:24: Jesus looked at him and said, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!

18:25: Indeed, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the **kingdom of God**."

18:29: And he said to them, "Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or wife or brothers or parents or children, for the sake of the **kingdom of God**,

19:11: As they were listening to this, he went on to tell a parable, because he was near Jerusalem, and because they supposed that the **kingdom of God** was to appear immediately.

19:12: So he said, "A nobleman went to a distant country to get a **kingdom** for himself and then return.

19:15: When he returned, having received a **kingdom**, he ordered these slaves, to whom he had given the money, to be summoned so that he might find out what they had gained by trading.

21:10: Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom;

21:31: So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the **kingdom of God** is near.

22:16: for I tell you, I will not eat it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God."

22:18: for I tell you that from now on I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes."

22:29: and I confer on you, just as my Father has conferred on me, a kingdom,

22:30: so that you may eat and drink at my table in my **kingdom**, and you will sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel.

23:42: Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

23:51: had not agreed to their plan and action. He came from the Jewish town of Arimathea, and he was waiting expectantly for the **kingdom of God**.
