2.4	These are the generations [toledot] of the heavens and the earth when they were created	Looking backward to Gen 1
5.1	This is the list of the descendants [sefer toledot] of Adam.	Begins with a paraphrase of 1.27-28
6.9	These are the descendants [toledot] of Noah.	Only the three sons named
10.1	These are the descendants [toledot] of Noah's sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth; children were born to them after the flood.	
10.32	These are the families of Noah's sons, according to their genealogies [toledot] , in their nations; and from these the nations spread abroad on the earth after the flood.	Looking backward to Gen 10
11.10	These are the descendants [toledot] of Shem	Only one son, Arpachshad, named [in Gen 10.22, Shem has five sons]
11.27	Now these are the descendants [toledot] of Terah	The lineage of Abram/Sarai
25.12	These are the descendants [toledot] of Ishmael, Abraham's son, whom Hagar the Egyptian, Sarah's slave-girl, bore to Abraham.	Placed after the Hagar/Ishmael stories
25.13	These are the names of the sons of Ishmael, named in the order [toledot] of their birth	Only genealogy with such a double use of <i>toledot</i> at the start
25.19	These are the descendants [toledot] of Isaac, Abraham's son	No children are named
36.1	These are the descendants [toledot] of Esau (that is, Edom)	Only one directly linked to a place with a different name
37.2	This is the story [toledot] of the family of Jacob	No genealogy at all
