

Language of amazement in Luke

CHAPTER/VERSE	PASSAGE
1.21	Meanwhile the people were waiting for Zechariah, and wondered [<i>thaumazō</i>] his delay in the sanctuary.
1.29	But she was much perplexed [<i>diatarassō</i>] by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be.
1.63	asked for a writing tablet and wrote, "His name is John." And all of them were amazed [<i>thaumazō</i>].
2.18	and all who heard it were amazed [<i>thaumazō</i>] at what the shepherds told them.
2.33	And the child's father and mother were amazed [<i>thaumazō</i>] at what was being said about him.
2.47	And all who heard him were amazed [<i>existēmi</i>] at his understanding and his answers.
2.48	When his parents saw him they were astonished [<i>ekplēssō</i>]; and his mother said to him, "Child, why have you treated us like this?"
4.22	All spoke well of him and were amazed [<i>thaumazō</i>] at the gracious words that came from his mouth.
4.32	They were astounded [<i>ekplēssō</i>] at his teaching, because he spoke with authority.
4.36	They were all amazed [<i>thambos</i>] and kept saying to one another, "What kind of utterance is this?"
5.9	For he and all who were with him were amazed [<i>thambos</i>] at the catch of fish that they had taken;
7.9	When Jesus heard this he was amazed [<i>thaumazō</i>] at him, and turning to the crowd that followed him, he said, "I tell you, not even in Israel have I found such faith."
8.25	He said to them, "Where is your faith?" They were afraid and amazed [<i>thaumazō</i>], and said to one another, "Who then is this, that he commands even the winds and the water, and they obey him?"
8.56	Her parents were astounded [<i>existēmi</i>]; but he ordered them to tell no one what had happened.
9.7	Now Herod the ruler heard about all that had taken place, and he was perplexed [<i>diaporeō</i>], because it was said by some that John had been raised from the dead,
9.43	And all were astounded [<i>ekplēssō</i>] at the greatness of God. While everyone was amazed [<i>thaumazō</i>] at all that he was doing...
11.14	Now he was casting out a demon that was mute; when the demon had gone out, the one who had been mute spoke, and the crowds were amazed [<i>thaumazō</i>].
11.38	The Pharisee was amazed [<i>thaumazō</i>] to see that he did not first wash before dinner.

20.26	And they were not able in the presence of the people to trap him by what he said; and being amazed [<i>thaumazō</i>] by his answer, they became silent.
24.4	While they were perplexed [<i>aporeō</i>] about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them.
24.12	But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed [<i>thaumazō</i>] at what had happened.
24.22	Moreover, some women of our group astounded [<i>existēmi</i>] us.
24.41	While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering [<i>thaumazō</i>], he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?"
