

“Questioning” [verb, *dialogizomai*; noun, *dialogismos*] in Luke’s Gospel

2.35	so that the inner thoughts [<i>dialogismoī</i>] of many will be revealed
3.15	As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning [<i>dialogizomenon</i>] in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah
5.21	Then the scribes and the Pharisees began to question [<i>dialogizesthai</i>], "Who is this who is speaking blasphemies?"
5.22	When Jesus perceived their questionings [<i>dialogismous</i>], he answered them, "Why do you raise such questions [<i>dialogizesthe</i>] in your hearts?"
6.8	Even though he knew what they were thinking [<i>dialogismous</i>]
9.46	An argument [<i>dialogismos</i>] arose among them as to which one of them was the greatest.
9.47	But Jesus, aware of their inner thoughts [<i>dialogismon</i>]
12.17	And he thought [<i>dielogizeto</i>] to himself, 'What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?'
20.17	But when the tenants saw him, they discussed [<i>dielogizonto</i>] it among themselves
