1.45	And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord."
6.20-22	<p>"Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.</p> <p>"Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled.</p> <p>"Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh.</p> <p>"Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Human One."</p>
7.23	"...blessed is anyone who takes no offense at me."
10.23	"Blessed are the eyes that see what you see!"
11.27-28	<p>"Blessed is the womb that bore you and the breasts that nursed you!"</p> <p>But he said, "Blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and obey it!"</p>
12.37-38, 43	<p>Blessed are those slaves whom the master finds alert when he comes; truly I tell you, he will fasten his belt and have them sit down to eat, and he will come and serve them. If he comes during the middle of the night, or near dawn, and finds them so, blessed are those slaves.... Blessed is that slave whom his master will find at work when he arrives.</p>
14.14	"And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."
23.29	"For the days are surely coming when they will say, 'Blessed are the barren, and the wombs that never bore, and the breasts that never nursed.'"
