

“Building” (Greek, *oikodomeō*) in Luke’s Gospel

4.29	They got up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built , so that they might hurl him off the cliff.
6.48-49	“That one is like a man building a house , who dug deeply and laid the foundation on rock; when a flood arose, the river burst against that house but could not shake it, because it had been well built . But the one who hears and does not act is like a man who built a house on the ground without a foundation. When the river burst against it, immediately it fell, and great was the ruin of that house.”
7.5	“...[the centurion] loves our people, and it is he who built our synagogue for us.”
11.47-48	“Woe to you! For you build the tombs of the prophets whom your ancestors killed. So you are witnesses and approve of the deeds of your ancestors; for they killed them, and you build their tombs.”
12.18	Then he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods.’”
14.28-30	“For which of you, intending to build a tower , does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it? Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, 'This fellow began to build and was not able to finish.’”
17.28-29	“Likewise, just as it was in the days of Lot: they were eating and drinking, buying and selling, planting and building , but on the day that Lot left Sodom, it rained fire and sulfur from heaven and destroyed all of them.”
20.17	But he looked at them and said, "What then does this text mean: 'The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone'?"
