

The Beatitudes in Luke 6.20-23 echoed elsewhere in Luke/Acts

<p>"Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God."</p>	<p>[see "The Poor in Luke" chart]</p>
<p>"Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled."</p>	<p>he has filled the hungry with good things... (1.53)</p> <p>And all ate and were filled. (9.17)</p>
<p>"Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh."</p>	<p>She stood behind him at his feet, weeping, and began to bathe his feet with her tears and to dry them with her hair...."I tell you, her sins, which were many, have been forgiven..." (7.38, 47)</p>
<p>"Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Human One.</p> <p>Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets.</p>	<p>You will be hated by all because of my name. But not a hair of your head will perish. (21.17-18)</p> <p>As they left the council, they rejoiced that they were considered worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name. (Acts 5.41)</p>
