A: 14.1-5: redemption of the 144,000, anticipating a series of seven heavenly creatures

B: 14.6-11: three angels as ABA chiasm

<u>A: first angel: loud voice, hour of judgment has come, worship the Creator</u> B: second angel: no loud voice: condemnation of Babylon <u>A¹: third angel: loud voice, worship of the beast results in torment</u>

14.6-7 parallels

14.6: Then I saw another angel flying in midheaven, with an eternal gospel to proclaim to those who live on the earth--*to every nation and tribe and language and people.*

14.7: He said in a loud voice, "Fear God and give him glory, for the hour of his judgment has come; and worship him who made **heaven and earth, the sea and the springs of water."**

14.8: Fallen is Babylon!

14.9-11 ABCBA chiasm

A: 14.9: "Those who *worship the beast and its image*, and receive a mark on their foreheads or on their hands

B: 14.10a: they will also drink the wine of God's wrath, poured unmixed into the cup of his anger

C: 14.10b-14.11a: [as C/C1]

they will be tormented with fire and sulfur in the presence of the holy angels and in the presence of the Lamb.

And the smoke of their torment goes up forever and ever. B¹: 14.11b: There is no rest day or night for those who worship the beast A¹: 14.11c: *worship the beast and its image* and for anyone who receives the mark of its name.

C: 4.12-14: Encouragement to the "saints": Human One on a cloud with a sharp sickle in his hand; call to "faithful resistance" and the promise of eternal rest

B1: 4.15-20: three angels as ABA chiasm

A: 14.15-16: <u>harvest of the saints</u>: angel calls on the previous angel to use the sickle and reap, giving a reason in an *hoti* ("because" or "for") clause and an aorist verb, followed by execution in two parts: the swung sickle, then the harvest

B: 14.17: next angel with sharp sickle

A¹: 14.17-20: <u>harvest of evildoers</u>: angel calls on the previous angel to use the sickle and reap, giving a reason in an *hoti* ("because" or "for") clause and an aorist verb, followed by execution in two parts: the swung sickle, then the harvest

A1: 15.1-8: celebration of God's justice and judgment
