Saul's son, Jonathan, in 1 Samuel

13.2	Saul chose three thousand out of Israel; two thousand were with Saul in Michmash and the hill country of Bethel, and a thousand were with Jona- than in Gibeah of Benjamin; the rest of the people he sent home to their tents.
13.3	Jonathan defeated the garrison of the Philistines that was at Geba; and the Philistines heard of it. And Saul blew the trumpet throughout all the land, saying, "Let the Hebrews hear!"
13.16	Saul, his son Jonathan, and the people who were present with them stayed in Geba of Benjamin
13.22	So on the day of the battle neither sword nor spear was to be found in the possession of any of the people with Saul and Jonathan; but Saul and his son Jonathan had them.
14.1-15	Jonathan and his armor bearer attack the Philistines on their own, killing 20, and evoking panic in the Philistine camp
14.27-49	The "honey incident": the people side with Jonathan against his father, the king
18.1-4	Jonathan and David make a covenant, expressing mutual love
19.1-7	Jonathan sides with David against Saul
20.1-42	David and Jonathan conspire against Saul; Saul tries to kill Jonathan and Jonathan sides again with David and makes a covenant with "the house of 'David"
23.16-18	For the third time, Jonathan and David make a covenant; Jonathan pre- dicts David's reign
31.2	Jonathan is killed by the Philistines
