Some questions raised by Genesis 12.5-9

- 1. How does Abram chose which direction to go or when to stay/leave from a location?
- 2. After living for 75 years in a walled city, how are we supposed to understand he has gained the skills needed to live as a wandering nomad?
- 3. Why do there seem to be no other people around as Abram travels near cities?
- 4. What might Sarai be thinking or feeling about all this? Or Lot?
- 5. In 12.7, how does Abram know that it is "YHWH" who is speaking to him, given his building an altar to YHWH?
- 6. In 12.7, what does it mean for YHWH to "give" land to Abram's "seed" when the Canaanites are already there?
- 7. Which "this land" are we or Abram to understand is being "given"?
- 8. In 12.8, why so much detail about local places, and the threefold use of "there" in vv. 7-8?
- 9. In 12.8, what does it mean that Abram "invoked" or "called upon" the name, YHWH?
- 10. In 12.9, why is Abram going to the southern desert, known as "the Negeb"?
