Luke	
4.39	[Jesus] stood over her and rebuked the fever, and it left her. Immediately she got up and began to serve them.
8.3	Joanna, the wife of Herod's steward Chuza, and Susanna, and many others, who provided for them out of their resources.
10.40	But Martha was distracted by her many tasks ; so she came to him and asked, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself?" [cf. John 12.2]
12.37	"Blessed are those slaves whom the master finds alert when he comes; truly I tell you, he will fasten his belt and have them sit down to eat, and he will come and serve them."
17.8	"Would you not rather say to him, 'Prepare supper for me, put on your apron and serve me while I eat and drink; later you may eat and drink!'"
22.26-27	But not so with you; rather the greatest among you must become like the youngest, and the leader like one who serves . For who is greater, the one who is at the table or the one who serves? Is it not the one at the table? But I am among you as one who serves .
Acts of the Apostles	
6.2	And the twelve called together the whole community of the disciples and said, "It is not right that we should neglect the word of God in order to wait on tables.
19.2	So he sent two of his helpers , Timothy and Erastus, to Macedonia, while he himself stayed for some time longer in Asia.
