

Hebrew Scriptures in Revelation 17-18

17.1: Seated on many waters	After two whole years, Pharaoh dreamed that he was standing on the Nile (Gen 41.1)
17.2: with whom the kings of the earth have committed fornication	[Tyre] will prostitute herself with all the kingdoms of the world on the face of the earth. (Isaiah 23.17)
17.2: with the wine of whose fornication the inhabitants of the earth have become drunk.	For the LORD comes out from his place to punish the inhabitants of the earth for their iniquity (Isaiah 26.21)
17.4: The woman was clothed in purple and scarlet , and adorned with gold and jewels and pearls	And you, O desolate one, what do you mean that you dress in crimson , that you deck yourself with ornaments of gold , that you enlarge your eyes with paint? (Jeremiah 4.30)
17.4: In her hand a golden cup	Babylon was a golden cup in the Lord's hand (Jeremiah 51.7)
17.4: full of abominations	in their place shall be an abomination that desolates (Daniel 9.27; also, 11.31; 12.11)
17.5: on her forehead was written a name, a mystery: "Babylon the great, mother of whores	you have the forehead of a whore (Jer 3.3)
17.5: Babylon the great	and the king said, "Is this not great Babylon , which I have built as a royal capital by my mighty power and for my glorious majesty?" (Daniel 4.30)
17.6: And I saw that the woman was drunk with the blood of the saints and the blood of the witnesses to Jesus.	I will make your oppressors eat their own flesh, and they shall be drunk with their own blood as with wine. (Isaiah 49.26)
17.8: whose names have not been written in the book of life from the foundation of the world	at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone who is found written in the book. (Daniel 12.1) 1 Enoch 108.3: for their names shall be blotted out of the book of life and out of the holy books
17.11: As for the beast that was and is not, it is an eighth but it belongs to the seven , and it goes to destruction.	Micah 5.5: If the Assyrians come into our land and tread upon our soil, we will raise against them seven shepherds and eight installed as rulers.
17.12: And the ten horns that you saw are ten kings	Daniel 7.24a: As for the ten horns , out of this kingdom ten kings shall arise , and another shall arise after them.

17.14: he is Lord of lords and King of kings	For YHWH your God is God of gods and Lord of lords (Deuteronomy 10.17) Lord of lords, God of gods, King of kings , and God of the ages (1 Enoch 9:4)
17.15: are peoples and multitudes and nations and languages	You are commanded, O peoples, nations, and languages (Daniel 3.4)
17.16: And the ten horns that you saw, they and the beast will hate the whore; they will make her desolate and naked; they will devour her flesh and burn her up with fire.	Therefore, O Oholibah, thus says the Lord YHWH: I will rouse against you your lovers from whom you turned in disgust, and I will bring them against you from every side (Ezekiel 23.22) For thus says YHWH GOD: I will deliver you into the hands of those whom you hate , into the hands of those from whom you turned in disgust; and they shall deal with you in hatred , and take away all the fruit of your labor, and leave you naked and bare, and the nakedness of your whorings shall be exposed . Your lewdness and your whorings have brought this upon you, because you played the whore with the nations, and polluted yourself with their idols. (Ezekiel 23.28-30) I brought out fire from within you; it consumed you , and I turned you to ashes on the earth in the sight of all who saw you. (Ezekiel 28.18)
17.16: they will make her desolate and naked	I am against you, says YHWH of hosts, and will lift up your skirts over your face; and I will let nations look on your nakedness and kingdoms on your shame . (Nahum 3.5)
17.18: the great city (and 18.10, 16, 18, 19, 21)	Resen between Nineveh and Calah; that is the great city . (Genesis 10.12) "Why has YHWH dealt in this way with that great city ?" (Jeremiah 22.8) "Go at once to Nineveh, that great city , and cry out against it..." (Jonah 1.2)
18.1: And the earth was made bright with his glory.	and the earth shone with his glory . (Ezekiel 43.2)
18.2: "Fallen, fallen is Babylon the great!"	"Fallen, fallen is Babylon..." (Isaiah 21.9)

	Suddenly Babylon has fallen and is shattered; wail for her! (Jeremiah 51.8, 49)
18.2: has become a dwelling place of demons, a haunt of every foul and hateful bird, a haunt of every foul and hateful beast.	But wild animals will lie down there, and its houses will be full of howling creatures; there ostriches will live, and there goat-demons will dance. (Isaiah 13.21)
18.3: For all the nations have drunk of the wine of the wrath of her fornication	the nations drank of her wine, and so the nations went mad. (Jeremiah 51.7)
18.3: the merchants of the earth have grown rich from the power of her luxury.	Tyre, the bestower of crowns, whose merchants were princes, whose traders were the honored of the earth? (Isaiah 23.8)
18.4: "Come out of her, my people!"	Go out from Babylon, flee from Chaldea, declare this with a shout of joy, proclaim it, send it forth to the end of the earth; say, "YHWH has redeemed his servant Jacob!" (Isaiah 48.20; also, 52.11) Flee from Babylon, and go out of the land of the Chaldeans (Jeremiah 50.8)
18.5: her sins are heaped high as heaven	[Babylon's] judgment has reached up to heaven and has been lifted up even to the skies. (Jeremiah 51.9)
18.6: repay her double for her deeds	[Jerusalem's] penalty is paid, that she has received from YHWH's hand double for all her sins. (Isaiah 40.2) And I will doubly repay their iniquity and their sin (Jeremiah 16.18; 17.18)
18.7: I rule as a queen	Because your [Tyre's] heart is proud and you have said, "I am a god; I sit in the seat of the gods, in the heart of the seas, " yet you are but a mortal, and no god, though you compare your mind with the mind of a god. (Ezekiel 28.2)
17.7: I am no widow, and I will never see grief	I shall not sit as a widow or know the loss of children (Isaiah 47.8)
18.8: her plagues will come in a single day	these things shall come upon you in a moment, in one day: the loss of children and widowhood shall come upon you in full measure, in spite of your many sorceries and the great power of your enchantments (Isaiah 47.9)
18.8: she will be burned with fire	your survivors shall be devoured by fire (Ezekiel 23.25)

<p>18.9: And the kings of the earth, who committed fornication and lived in luxury with her</p>	<p>with your abundant wealth and merchandise you enriched the kings of the earth. (Ezekiel 27.33)</p>
<p>18.9: will weep and wail over her when they see the smoke of her burning</p>	<p>[Abraham] looked down toward Sodom and Gomorrah and toward all the land of the Plain and saw the smoke of the land going up like the smoke of a furnace. (Genesis 19.28)</p> <p>Babylon, the glory of kingdoms, the splendor and pride of the Chaldeans, will be like Sodom and Gomorrah when God overthrew them. (Isaiah 13.19)</p>
<p>18.11: And the merchants of the earth weep and mourn for her</p>	<p>The merchants among the peoples hiss at you; you have come to a dreadful end and shall be no more forever. (Ezekiel 27.36)</p>
<p>18.12-13: cargo of gold, silver, jewels and pearls, fine linen, purple, silk and scarlet, all kinds of scented wood, all articles of ivory, all articles of costly wood, bronze, iron, and marble, cinnamon, spice, incense, myrrh, frankincense, wine, olive oil, choice flour and wheat, cattle and sheep, horses and chariots, slaves- and human lives.</p>	<p>Tarshish did business with you out of the abundance of your great wealth; silver, iron, tin, and lead they exchanged for your wares. Javan, Tubal, and Meshech traded with you; they exchanged human beings and vessels of bronze for your merchandise. Beth-togarmah exchanged for your wares horses, war horses, and mules. The Rhodians traded with you; many coastlands were your own special markets; they brought you in payment ivory tusks and ebony. Edom did business with you because of your abundant goods; they exchanged for your wares turquoise, purple, embroidered work, fine linen, coral, and rubies. Judah and the land of Israel traded with you; they exchanged for your merchandise wheat from Minneth, millet, honey, oil, and balm. Damascus traded with you for your abundant goods--because of your great wealth of every kind--wine of Helbon, and white wool. Vedan and Javan from Uzal entered into trade for your wares; wrought iron, cassia, and sweet cane were bartered for your merchandise. Dedan traded with you in saddlecloths for riding. Arabia and all the princes of Kedar were your favored dealers in lambs, rams, and goats; in these they did business with you. The merchants of Sheba and Raamah traded with you; they exchanged for your wares the best of all kinds of spices, and all precious stones, and gold. Haran, Canneh, Eden, the merchants of Sheba, Asshur, and Chilmad traded with you. These traded with you in choice garments, in clothes of blue and embroidered work, and in carpets of colored material, bound</p>

	with cords and made secure; in these they traded with you. (Ezekiel 27.12-24)
18.14: The fruit for which your life longed has gone from you	upon your summer fruits and your vintage the destroyer has fallen. (Jeremiah 48.32)
18.17b-19: And all shipmasters and seafarers, sailors and all whose trade is on the sea, stood far off and cried out as they saw the smoke of her burning, "What city was like the great city?" And they threw dust on their heads, as they wept and mourned, crying out, " Alas, alas, the great city, where all who had ships at sea grew rich by her wealth! For in one hour she has been laid waste. "	The mariners and all the pilots of the sea stand on the shore and wail aloud over you, and cry bitterly. They throw dust on their heads and wallow in ashes; they make themselves bald for you, and put on sackcloth, and they weep over you in bitterness of soul, with bitter mourning. In their wailing they raise a lamentation for you, and lament over you: " Who was ever destroyed like Tyre in the midst of the sea? " (Ezekiel 27.29-32)
18.20: Rejoice over her, O heaven, you saints and apostles and prophets! For God has given judgment for you against her.	Sing, O heavens, for YHWH has done it; shout, O depths of the earth; break forth into singing, (Isaiah 44.23)
18.21: Then a mighty angel took up a stone like a great millstone and threw it into the sea, saying, "With such violence Babylon the great city will be thrown down, and will be found no more"	When you finish reading this scroll, tie a stone to it, and throw it into the middle of the Euphrates, and say, 'Thus shall Babylon sink, to rise no more, because of the disasters that I am bringing on her.' (Jeremiah 51.63)
18.22: and the sound of harpists...will be heard in you no more	Your pomp is brought down to Sheol, and the sound of your harps (Isaiah 14.11)
18.22: minstrels and of flutists and trumpeters will be heard in you no more	I will silence the music of your songs; the sound of your lyres shall be heard no more. (Ezekiel 26.13) And I will banish from them the sound of mirth and the sound of gladness... (Jeremiah 25.10)
18.22: and the sound of the millstone will be heard in you no more	the sound of the millstones (Jeremiah 25.10)
18.23: and the light of a lamp will shine in you no more	and the light of the lamp. (Jeremiah 25.10)
18.23: and the voice of bridegroom and bride will be heard in you no more	the voice of the bridegroom and the voice of the bride (Jeremiah 25.10)
18.23: your merchants were the magnates of the earth	[Tyre] whose merchants were princes, whose traders were the honored of the earth? (Isaiah 23.8)
