A verbal chiasm:

- 8.27** As he stepped out on land, a man [*aner*] of the city who had demons met him.
- 8.29** Jesus had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man [*anthropos*].
- 8.33** Then the demons came out of the man [*anthropos*]
- 8.35** they found the man [*anthropos*] from whom the demons had gone
- 8.38** The man [*aner*] from whom the demons had gone
