## Some questions raised in Revelation 19-20

- 1. Why not jump straight from the fall of Babylon (Rev 17-18) to the descent of New Jerusalem (Rev 21-22)?
- 2. What is the chronological relationship among the "events" narrated in these two chapters?
- 3. How do these chapters echo/anticipate other parts of Revelation (intratextually)?
- 4. What echoes of Hebrew Scripture do we hear in these chapters (intertextually)?
- 5. What is the relationship between the "marriage supper of the Lamb" (19.9) and the "great supper of God" (19.17-18)?
- 6. How do the war scenes here relate to the one in Rev 13?
- 7. Why is Satan thrown in a pit for 1000 years (20.2-3)? And why then is he released, only to be thrown into the lake of fire (20.9-10)?
- 8. What is "the first resurrection" (20.5)? How does it relate to any other "resurrections"?
- 9. What is "the second death" (20.6)?
- 10. What are "Gog and Magog" (20.8)?
- 11. What are the various "books" that are opened (20.12)?
- 12. If all those not written in the book of life are thrown into the lake of fire (20.15; 21.8), then who are the people outside the gates of New Jerusalem (22.15)?
