| 16.14 | Therefore the well was called Beer-lahai-roi; it lies between Kadesh and <br> Bered. |

| 27.19 | Then God opened [Hagar's] eyes and she saw a well of water. She went, and <br> filled the skin with water, and gave the boy a drink. |
| $21.25,30$ | When Abraham complained to Abimelech about a well of water that <br> Abimelech's servants had seized...He said, "These seven ewe lambs you shall <br> accept from my hand, in order that you may be a witness for me that I dug <br> this well." |
| $24.11,20$ | [Abraham's servant] made the camels kneel down outside the city by the <br> well of water; it was toward evening, the time when women go out to draw <br> water....So she quickly emptied her jar into the trough and ran again to the <br> well to draw, and she drew for all his camels. |
| 26.15, | Now the Philistines had stopped up and filled with earth all the wells that <br> [lsaac's] father's servants had dug in the days of his father Abraham...Isaac <br> dug again the wells of water that had been dug in the days of his father Abra- <br> ham. But when Isaac's servants dug in the valley and found there a well of <br> spring water, the herders of Gerar quarreled with Isaac's herders, saying, <br> "The water is ours." So he called the well Esek, because they contended with <br> him. Then they dug another well, and they quarreled over that one also; so <br> he called it Sitnah. He moved from there and dug another well, and they did <br> not quarrel over it; so he called it Rehoboth, saying, "Now YHWH has made <br> room for us, and we shall be fruitful in the land..... So he built an altar there, <br> called on the name of YHWH, and pitched his tent there. And there Isaac's <br> servants dug a well. |
| 29.2-3 | [Jacob] looked, he saw a well in the field and three flocks of sheep lying <br> there beside it; for out of that well the flocks were watered. The stone on the <br> well's mouth was large, and when all the flocks were gathered there, the <br> shepherds would roll the stone from the mouth of the well, and water the <br> sheep, and put the stone back in its place on the mouth of the well. |
| 29.8-10 | But they said, "We cannot until all the flocks are gathered together, and <br> the stone is rolled from the mouth of the well; then we water the sheep." <br> While he was still speaking with them, Rachel came with her father's sheep; <br> for she kept them. Now when Jacob saw Rachel, the daughter of his mother's <br> brother Laban, and the sheep of his mother's brother Laban, Jacob went up <br> and rolled the stone from the well's mouth, and watered the flock of his <br> mother's brother Laban. |
