Saul spoke with his son Jonathan and with all his servants about **killing** [*moth*] David. But Saul's son Jonathan took great delight in David. Jonathan told David, "**My father** Saul is trying **to kill** you; therefore be on guard tomorrow morning; stay in a secret place and hide yourself. I will go out and stand at the <u>hand</u> of **my father** in the field where you are, and I will speak to **my father** about you; if I learn anything I will tell you." Jonathan spoke well of David to **his father** Saul, saying to him, "The **king should not sin** against his servant David, because **he has not sinned** against you, and because his deeds have been of good service to you; for he took his life in his hand when he attacked the Philistine, and YHWH brought about a great victory for all Israel. You saw it, and rejoiced; why then **will you sin** against an innocent person by **killing** David without cause?" Now David **fled** [*brch*] and **escaped**; he came to Samuel at **Ramah**, and told him all that Saul had done to him. He and Samuel went and settled at **Naioth**. Saul was told, "David is at **Naioth in Ramah**." Then Saul **let go messengers** to take David. When they saw the company of the prophets in a **frenzy**, with Samuel standing in charge of them, the spirit of God came upon the **messengers** of Saul, and they **also** fell into **a prophetic frenzy**. When Saul was told, he **let go** other **messengers**, and they **also** fell into **a frenzy**. Saul **let go messengers** again the third time, and they **also** fell into **a frenzy**. Then he **also** went to **Ramah**. He came to the great well that is in Secu; he asked, "Where are Samuel and David?" And someone said, "They are at **Naioth in Ramah**." He went there, toward **Naioth in Ramah**; and the spirit of God **also** came upon him. As he was going, he fell into **a prophetic frenzy** before Samuel. He lay naked all that day and all that night. Therefore it is said, "Is Saul **also** among the prophets?"
