## Elijah in Luke's Gospel

1.17	With the spirit and power of <b>Elijah</b> he will go before him, to turn the hearts of parents to their children, and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous, to make ready a people prepared for the Lord."
4.25- 26	the truth is, there were many widows in Israel in the time of <b>Elijah</b> , when the heaven was shut up three years and six months, and there was a severe famine over all the land; yet <b>Elijah</b> was sent to none of them except to a widow at Za- rephath in Sidon.
9.7-8	Now Herod the ruler heard about all that had taken place, and he was perplexed, because it was said by some that John had been raised from the dead, by some that <b>Elijah</b> had appeared, and by others that one of the ancient prophets had arisen.
9.18b- 19	he asked them, "Who do the crowds say that I am?" They answered, "John the Baptist; but others, <b>Elijah</b> ; and still others, that one of the ancient prophets has arisen."
9.30- 31	Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and <b>Elijah</b> , talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem.
9.33	Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for <b>Elijah</b> "not knowing what he said.

Note that Elijah is not mentioned again once Jesus starts for Jerusalem at Luke 9.51.
