

Rare words in the Good Samaritan story, Luke 10.30-35

10.30: “stripped”: *ekousantes*, Mt 27.28, 31; Mk 15.20; 2 Cor 5.3-4 only elsewhere in NT

10.30: “fell into the hands of”: *periepesen*; only Acts 27.41; James 1.2 elsewhere in NT

10.30: “half-dead”: *hēmithanēs*; only 4 Maccabees 4.11 in Greek Bible

10.31: “by chance”: *sugkurian*, only here in Greek Bible

10.31, 32: “he passed”: *antiparelthen*, only these two verses in NT

10.34: “bandaged”: *katedesen*, only here in NT

10.34: “wounds”: *trauma*, only here in NT

10.34: “having poured”: *epicheōn*, only here in NT

10.34: “animal”: *ktēnos*, Acts 23.24; 1 Cor 15.39; Rev 18.13 only elsewhere in NT

10.34, 35: “took care”, *epimeleomai*, 1 Tim 3.5 only elsewhere in NT

10.34: “inn”, *pandocheion*, only here in NT

10.35: “innkeeper,” *pandochei*, only here in NT

10.35: “come back”: *epanerchomai*, 19.15, only elsewhere in NT

10.35: “whatever more you spend”: *prosdapanaō*, only here in NT
