## "Beer-sheba" ["well of seven") in Genesis and beyond in the Bible

21.14	And [Hagar] departed, and wandered about in the wilderness of Beersheba.
21.31-33	Therefore that place was called Beer-sheba; because there [Abimelech and Abraham] swore an oath. When they had made a covenant at Beer-sheba, Abimelech, with Phicol the commander of his army, left and returned to the land of the Philistines. Abraham planted a tamarisk tree in Beer-sheba, and called there on the name of YHWH, the Everlasting God.
22.19	So Abraham returned to his young men, and they arose and went together to Beer-sheba; and <b>Abraham lived at Beer-sheba</b> .
26.23	From [Rehoboth, <b>Isaac] went up to Beer-sheba</b> .
26.32-33	That same day Isaac's servants came and told him about the well that they had dug, and said to him, " <b>We have found water</b> !" He called it Shibah; therefore the name of the city is <b>Beer-sheba to this day</b> .
28.10	Jacob left Beer-sheba and went toward Haran.
46.1	When Israel [= Jacob] set out on his journey with all that he had and came to Beer-sheba, he offered sacrifices to the God of his father Isaac.
46.5	Then <b>Jacob set out from Beer-sheba</b> ; and the sons of Israel carried their father Jacob, their little ones, and their wives, in the wagons that Pharaoh had sent to carry him.
As description of the breadth of the land: "from Dan to Beersheba": Judges 20.1; 1 Sam 3.20; 2 Sam 3.10; 17.11; 24.2, 15; 1 Kg 4.25; cf. Amos 8.14	
1 Kg 19.3	Then [Elijah] was afraid; he got up and fled for his life, and came to Beer-sheba, which belongs to Judah
2 Kg 23.8	[Josiah] brought all the priests out of the towns of Judah, and defiled the high places where the priests had made offerings, from Geba to Beer-sheba
Neh 11.30	So [the people of the land] camped from Beer-sheba to the valley of Hinnom.
Amos 5.5	do not seek Bethel, and do not enter into Gilgal or cross over to Beersheba; for Gilgal shall surely go into exile, and Bethel shall come to nothing.
