A: v. 22-23: At that time Abimelech, with Phicol the commander of his army, said to Abraham, "God is with you in all that you do; now therefore swear to me here by God that you will not deal falsely with me or with my son or my grandson, but as I have dealt loyally with you, you will deal with me and with **the land where you** have resided as an alien."

B: v. 24 And Abraham said, "I swear it."

C: vv.25-26: When Abraham complained to Abimelech about **a well of water** that Abimelech's servants had seized, Abimelech said, "I do not know who has done this; you did not tell me, and I have not heard of it until today."

D: v. 27a: So Abraham took **sheep and oxen** and gave them to Abimelech,

E: v. 27b: and the two men made a covenant.

D': vv. 28-30a: Abraham set apart seven ewe lambs of the flock. And Abimelech said to Abraham, "What is the meaning of these seven ewe lambs that you have set apart?" He said, "These seven ewe lambs you shall accept from my hand,

C': v. 30b: in order that you may be a witness for me that I dug this well."

B¹: v. 31: Therefore that place was called Beer-sheba; because there both of them swore an oath.

A_i: vv. 32-34: When they had made a covenant at Beer-sheba, **Abimelech, with Phicol the commander of his army,** left and returned to the land of the Philistines. Abraham planted a tamarisk tree in Beer-sheba, and **called there on the name of YHWH, the Everlasting God.** And Abraham **resided as an alien** many days **in the land of the Philistines**.
