GOSPEL OF LUKE	
7.6	And Jesus went with them, but when he was not far from the house, the centu- rion sent <b>friends</b> to say to him, "Lord, do not trouble yourself, for I am not worthy to have you come under my roof"
7.34	the Human One has come eating and drinking, and you say, 'Look, a glutton and a drunkard, a <b>friend</b> of tax collectors and sinners!'
11.5-6	And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a <b>friend</b> , and you go to him at midnight and say to him, ' <b>Friend</b> , lend me three loaves of bread; for a <b>friend</b> of mine has arrived, and I have nothing to set before him.'"
11.8	I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his <b>friend</b> , at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs.
12.4	I tell you, my <b>friends</b> , do not fear those who kill the body, and after that can do nothing more.
14.10	But when you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, ' <b>Friend</b> , move up higher'; then you will be hon- ored in the presence of all who sit at the table with you."
14.12	He said also to the one who had invited him, "When you give a luncheon or a din- ner, do not invite your <b>friends</b> or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbors, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid."

15.29	But he answered his father, 'Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my <b>friends</b> ."
16.9	And I tell you, make <b>friends</b> for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone, they may welcome you into the eternal homes.
21.16	You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and <b>friends</b> ; and they will put some of you to death.
23.12	That same day Herod and Pilate became <b>friends</b> with each other; before this they had been enemies.
ACTS OF THE APOSTLES	
10.24	The following day they came to Caesarea. Cornelius was expecting them and had called together his relatives and close <b>friends</b> .
19.30- 31	Paul wished to go into the crowd, but the disciples would not let him; even some officials of the province of Asia, who were <b>friends</b> to him, sent him a message urging him not to venture into the theater.
27.3	The next day we put in at Sidon; and Julius treated Paul kindly, and allowed him to go to his <b>friends</b> to be cared for.
