Structure of Luke 11.5-8 (Bailey, p. 120)

A WHAT WILL NOT HAPPEN

1: request: and saying to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves"

2: reason for request: "for a friend of mine has arrived on a journey"

3: appeal to duty: "and I have nothing to set before him"

3': duty refused: "and will he answer from within, 'Don't bother me'

2': **reason for refusal**: "The door is now closed and my children are in bed with me."

1': request refused: "I cannot get up and give you anything"

B (WHAT WILL HAPPEN)

1: not answer request: "though he will not give him anything"

2: arising: "having arisen"

3: not for friendship's sake: "because of being his friend"

3': **but for honor's sake**: "but because of his avoidance of shame" [Note: the "shamelessness" could also be the requester's attribute]

2': will arise: "he will get up"

1': request granted (give): "and give him whatever whe wants"
