

## Intention or authority to kill in Luke's Gospel

4.28-29	When they heard this, <b>all in the synagogue</b> were filled with rage. They got up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, so that they <b>might hurl him off the cliff</b> .
4.34-35	"Let us alone! What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? <b>Have you come to destroy us?</b> I know who you are, the Holy One of God." But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" When the demon had thrown him down before them, <b>he came out of him without having done him any harm</b> .
8.33	Then the <b>demons came out</b> of the man and entered the swine, and the <b>herd</b> rushed down the steep bank into the lake and <b>was drowned</b> .
9.9	<b>Herod said, "John I beheaded;</b> but who is this about whom I hear such things?" And he tried to see him.
9.22	" <b>The Human One must</b> undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, chief priests, and scribes, and <b>be killed</b> , and on the third day be raised."
9.54-55	When his <b>disciples James and John</b> saw it, they said, "Lord, <b>do you want us to command fire to come down from heaven and consume them?</b> " <b>But he turned and rebuked them</b> .
10.30	Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of <b>robbers</b> , who stripped him, beat him, and went away, <b>leaving him half dead.</b> "
11.48-50	So you [ <b>lawyers</b> ] are <b>witnesses and approve of the deeds of your ancestors; for they killed them</b> , and you build their tombs. Therefore also the Wisdom of God said, 'I will send them prophets and apostles, some of whom they will kill and persecute,' so that this generation may be charged with the blood of all the prophets shed since the foundation of the world..."
12.4-5	"I tell you, my friends, <b>do not fear those who kill the body</b> , and after that can do nothing more. But I will warn you whom to fear: <b>fear the one who, after he has killed, has authority to cast into gehenna</b> . Yes, I tell you, fear that one!"
12.20	But <b>God said</b> to him, "You fool! <b>This very night your life is being demanded of you.</b> "
13.1	At that very time there were some present who told him about the <b>Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices</b> .
13.31	At that very hour some Pharisees came and said to him, "Get away from here, for <b>Herod wants to kill you.</b> "
13.34	" <b>Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets</b> and stones those who are sent to it!"
17.28-30	Likewise, just as it was in the <b>days of Lot</b> : they were eating and drinking, buying and selling, planting and building, but on the day that Lot left Sodom, it <b>rained fire and sulfur from heaven and destroyed all of them</b> --it will be like that on the day that the Human One is revealed.
18.32-33	he will be handed over to <b>the Gentiles</b> ; and he will be mocked and insulted and spat upon. After they have flogged him, <b>they will kill him</b> , and on the third day he will rise again."
19.27	"But as for these <b>enemies of mine who did not want me to be king</b> over them--bring them here and <b>slaughter them in my presence.</b> "
20.14-16a	But when the <b>tenants</b> saw him, they discussed it among themselves and <b>said, 'This is the heir; let us kill him</b> so that the inheritance may be ours. So <b>they threw him out of the vineyard and killed him</b> . What then will the owner of the vineyard do to them? He will come and destroy those tenants and give the vineyard to others."
21.16	"You will be <b>betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death.</b> "
21.23b-24	For there will be great distress on the earth and wrath against this people; <b>they will fall by the edge of the sword</b> and be taken away as captives among all nations; and <b>Jerusalem will be trampled on by the Gentiles</b> , until the times of the Gentiles are fulfilled.
22.2	<b>The chief priests and the scribes were looking for a way to put Jesus to death</b> , for they were afraid of the people.
23.20-21	Pilate, wanting to release Jesus, addressed them again; but <b>they kept shouting, "Crucify, crucify him!"</b> "
23.32	<b>Two others also, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death</b> with him.
