

Verbals links between 1 Samuel 25 and 1 Samuel 24 and 26

Nabal's home is Maon (25.2)	David and his men were in the wilderness of Maon , where Saul pursued him (23.24.-25)
[Nabal] had three thousand sheep [zo'n] and a thousand goats . (25.2)	Then Saul took three thousand chosen men out of all Israel, and went to look for David and his men in the direction of the Rocks of the Wild Goats . (24.2) He came to the sheepfolds [zo'n] beside the road, where there was a cave; and Saul went in to relieve himself. (24.3)
he was a Calebite [kalibi] (25.3)	Whom do you pursue? A dead dog [kaleb] ? (24.14)
Thus you shall salute him: ' Peace [shalom] be to you, and peace be to your house, and peace be to all that you have. (25.6)	... may YHWH give you peace/compensation [shlm, verb form, only here in 1 Samuel] with good for what you have done to me this day. (24.19)
" son David " (25.8)	Saul said, "Is this your voice, my son David ?" (24.16) Saul recognized David's voice, and said, "Is this your voice, my son David ?" (26.17; also, 26.21, 25)
There are many servants today who are breaking away from their lords ['adon] (25.10)	27/38 uses of "lord" ['adon] in 1 Samuel are in chs. 24-26
[David said about Nabal] "he has returned me evil for good ." (25.21)	[Saul] said to David, "You are more righteous than I; for you have repaid me good, whereas I have repaid you evil . (24.17)
God do so to David and more also, if by morning I leave so much as one who pisses against the wall ." (25.22)	there was a cave; and Saul went in to relieve himself . (24.3)
[Abigail] fell before David on her face, bowing to the ground . (25.23)	When Saul looked behind him, David bowed with his face to the ground , and did obeisance. (24.8)
let your enemies and those who seek to do evil to my lord be like Nabal . (25.26; also, 25.29)	The men of David said to him, "Here is the day of which YHWH said to you, 'I will give your enemy into your hand' (24.4a) Abishai said to David, " God has given your enemy into your hand today" (26.8)
Please forgive the trespass [pesha`] of your servant... (25.28) [pesha` only these two places in 1-2 Samuel]	that I cut off the corner of your cloak, and did not kill you, you may know for certain that there is no evil or trespass [pesha`] in my hands. (24.11a)
If a man ['adam] should rise up to pursue you and to seek your life ... (25.29)	"[David said to Saul] and a man ['adam] urged me to kill you , but I spared you. (24.10) [David to Saul]: "Whom do you pursue ?" (24.14) [David to Saul]: " Why does my lord pursue his servant? " (26.18) David said to Saul, "Why do you listen to the words of those who say, ' David seeks to do you harm '?" (24.9)
[David to Abigail]: Blessed be your good sense, and blessed be you (25.33)	Then Saul said to David, " Blessed be you , my son David!" (26.25)
[David to Abigail]: [YHWH] has restrained me from hurting [r` `] you ..." (25.34)	Then Saul said, "I have done wrong; come back, my son David, for I will never harm [r` `] you again..." (26.21)
[Nabal (fool)] he was holding a feast in his house, like the feast of a king . (25.36)	[Saul the king] : "I have been a fool " (26.21)
About ten days later YHWH struck [ngf] Nabal , and he died. (25.38)	David said, "As YHWH lives, YHWH will strike [ngf] him down ..." (26.10)
