Genesis 23 keywords

Sarah lived one hundred years and twenty years and seven, years, yes, years; this was the length of Sarah's life. And Sarah died at Kiriath-arba (**that is, Hebron) in the land of Canaan**; and **Abraham** went in to mourn for Sarah and to weep for her.

Abraham stood up from beside his dead, and said to the Hittites, "I am a stranger and an alien residing <u>among you</u>; give me **possession** <u>among you</u> for a <u>burying</u> **place**, so that I may <u>bury my dead</u> away from my <u>face</u>." The Hittites answered Abraham, "Hear us, my lord; you are a mighty prince <u>among us</u>. <u>Bury your dead</u> in the choicest of our <u>burial places</u>; which man will withhold from you any <u>burial</u> ground for <u>burying your dead</u>."

Abraham stood up and bowed to the **face** of the **Hittites**, the **people of the land**. He said to them, "If you are willing that I should <u>bury my dead</u> away from my **face**, **hear me**, and entreat for me **Ephron** son of Zohar, so that he may **give** me the **cave** of Machpelah, which is his; it is at the end of his **field**. For the full price let him **give** it to me **in your presence** as a **possession** for a **burying place**."

Now **Ephron** was sitting **among the Hittites**; and **Ephron** the **Hittite** answered **Abraham** in the ears of the **Hittites**, of <u>all who went in at the gate of his city</u>, "No, my lord, **hear me**; I **give** you the **field**, and I **give** you the **cave** that is in it; <u>in the eyes of</u> <u>my people</u> I **give** it to you; <u>bury your dead</u>."

Then **Abraham** bowed to the **face** the **people of the land**. He said to **Ephron** in the ears of the **people of the land**, "If you only will **listen** to me! I will **give** the price of the **field**; accept it from me, so that I may **bury** my **dead** there." **Ephron** answered **Abraham**, "My lord, **listen to me**; a piece of land worth four hundred shekels of silver--what is that between you and me? <u>Bury your **dead**</u>."

Abraham listened to Ephron; and Abraham weighed out for Ephron the silver that he had named in the ears of the Hittites, four hundred shekels of silver, according to the weights current among the merchants. So the field of Ephron in Machpelah, which was to the face of Mamre, the field with the cave that was in it and all the trees that were in the field, throughout its whole area, passed to Abraham as a possession in the eyes of the Hittites, in the presence of all who went in at the gate of his city. After this, Abraham buried Sarah his woman in the cave of the field of Machpelah facing Mamre (that is, Hebron) in the land of Canaan. The field and the cave that is in it passed from the Hittites into Abraham's possession as a burying place.
