Now Abraham was old, well advanced in years; and YHWH had blessed Abraham in all things. Behold, I am standing here by the spring of water; let the young woman who comes out to draw, to whom I shall say, "Please give me a little water from your jar to drink," and who will say to me, "Drink, and I will draw for your camels also"--let her be the woman whom YHWH has appointed for my lord's **son**.' "Before I had finished speaking in my heart, **behold,** there was **Rebekah** coming out with her water jar on her shoulder; and she went down to the spring, and drew. I said to her, Please let me **drink**.' She quickly let down her **jar** from her shoulder, and said, **Drink**, and I will also water your **camels**.' So I drank, and she also watered the **camels**. Then I asked her, 'Whose daughter are you?' She said, 'The daughter of Bethuel, Nahor's **son**, whom Milcah bore to him.'
