

## “Hate” [*miseō*] in Luke (not in Acts)

1.71	that <u>we would be saved from</u> our enemies and from the hand <b>of all who hate us.</b>
6.22	" <u>Blessed are you when</u> people <b>hate you</b> , and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Human One."
6.27	"But I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, <u>do good to</u> <b>those who hate you...</b> "
14.26	"Whoever comes to me and <b>does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself</b> , <u>cannot be my disci- ple.</u> "
16.13	"No slave can serve two masters; for <b>a slave will either hate the one</b> and love the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other. <u>You cannot serve God and wealth.</u> "
19.14	But the <b>citizens of his country hated him</b> and sent a delegation after him, saying, ' <u>We do not want this man to rule over us.</u> '
21.17-18	<b>You will be hated</b> by all because of my name. <u>But not a hair of your head will perish.</u>
