"not strong enough" [ou ischuō] in Luke

That one is like a man building a house, who dug deeply and laid the foundation on rock; when a flood arose, <u>the river burst</u> against that house but **was not strong enough,** because it had been well built. (6.48)

Now there was a woman who had been suffering from hemorrhages for twelve years; and though she had spent all she had on physicians, **no one was strong enough to cure her.** (8.43)

"Strive to enter through the narrow door; for <u>many</u>, I tell you, will try to enter and **will not be strong enough."** (13.24)

"Otherwise, when <u>he has laid a foundation</u> and **is not strong enough** <u>to finish</u>, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, saying, <u>'This fellow began to build and</u> **was not strong enough** <u>to finish</u>." (14.29-30)

Then the manager said to himself, 'What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me? **I am not strong enough to dig**, and I am ashamed to beg." (16.3)

And **they were not strong enough** in the presence of the people to trap him by what he said; and being amazed by his answer, they became silent. (20.26)
