15.11-32 and 16.19-31 parallels

- 1. Abraham = Father
- 2. Rich man = elder brother (being apart from the one he rejected)
- 3. Lazarus = prodigal (hungry; longing for food)
- 4. Rich man/elder each called "son"/"child" by "father"
- 5. Lazarus/prodigal with lowly animals (dogs/pigs)
- 6. Father looks up and sees prodigal at a distance; rich man looks up and sees Abraham at a distance
- 7. Prodigal/Lazarus were dead then alive
- 8. "Father's house" in both stories
- 9. Conversation with the father that ends without a clear outcome
