<p>"The law and the prophets were in effect until <b>John</b> came; since then the good news of <b>the kingdom</b> of God is proclaimed, and everyone tries to enter it <b>by force</b>. (16.16)</p> <p><i>John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. (3.16)</i></p>	<p>From the days of <b>John</b> the Baptist until now <b>the kingdom</b> of heaven has suffered violence, and the violent take <b>it by force</b>. (11.12)</p>
<p>But it is easier for <b>heaven and earth to pass away</b>, than for <b>one stroke of a letter</b> in the law to be dropped. (16.17)</p> <p><i>Herod the ruler, who had been rebuked by him... (3.19a)</i></p>	<p>For truly I tell you, until <b>heaven and earth pass away</b>, not one letter, not <b>one stroke of a letter</b>, will pass from the law until all is accomplished. (5.18)</p>
<p>"<b>Anyone who divorces his wife</b> and marries another commits adultery, and <b>whoever marries a woman divorced</b> from her husband <b>commits adultery</b>. (16.18)</p> <p><i>...because of Herodias, his brother's wife...(3.19b)</i></p>	<p>But I say to you that <b>anyone who divorces his wife</b>, except on the ground of unchastity, causes her to commit adultery; and <b>whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery</b>. (5.32)</p>
