Questionable assumptions to be addressed in the story of the blessing (Genesis 26.34-28.9)

- 1. That the **oracle in Genesis 25** conveys YHWH's will that Jacob (Israel) would rule over Esau (Edom).
- 2. That the **twins physical features (hairy/smooth**) reflect something of their interior lives/spirituality.
- 3. That the **supposed "rights of the firstborn" (birthright, blessing**) are divinely sanctioned.
- 4. That Isaac is weak as a father and is being manipulated by Rebekah and Jacob.
- 5. That a **human father can convey the "Abrahamic blessing**" to his son(s). Similarly, that Isaac's blessing to Jacob "fulfills" the oracle.
- 6. That we are expected to see **Jacob's deception of his father as morally "bad**" and a mark on Jacob's (and Rebekah's) character.
- 7. That the words Isaac conveys to his sons as "blessing" have actual power to shape the future.
- 8. That the parents' sending Jacob back to the "old country" is an emergency expedient because of Esau's anger (rather than the plan all along to get Jacob to Laban).
- 9. That Laban's later deception of Jacob (regarding Rachel/Leah) is divine "karma" for Jacob's decption of his father.
- 10. As readers, it is imperative to render a (moral) judgment on the character of each of the people in the story.
