6.24	"But <u>woe to you who are</u> <b>rich</b> , for you have received your consolation."
12.16	Then he told them a parable: " <u>The land of a</u> <b>rich</b> <u>man produced abundantly"</u>
14.12	He said also to the one who had invited him, "When you give a luncheon or a dinner, <u>do not invite</u> your friends or your brothers or your relatives or <b>rich</b> <u>neighbors</u> , in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid."
16.1	Then Jesus said to the disciples, "There was <b>a rich man who had a manager</b> , and charges were brought to him that this man was squandering his property."
16.19- 22	"There was a <b>rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day</b> . And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table; even the dogs would come and lick his sores. The poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried.

19.2	A man was there named <u>Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax collector</u> and was <b>rich</b> .
21.1-3	He looked up and saw <b>rich</b> <u>people putting their gifts into the treasury</u> ; he also saw a poor widow put in two small copper coins. He said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all of them"
