| 3.14 | "Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages." |

| 7.41 | certain creditor had two debtors; one owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. |
| 9.3 | "Take nothing for your journey, no staff, nor bag, nor bread, nor money-not even an extra tunic. |
| 9.13 | But he said to them, "You give them something to eat." They said, "We have no more than five loaves and two fish--unless we are to go and buy food for all these people." |
