3.12	Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?"
5.27	After this he went out and saw a tax collector <u>named Levi</u> , sitting at the tax booth; and he said to him, "Follow me."
5.29-32	Then Levi gave a great banquet for him in his house; and there was a large crowd of tax collectors and others sitting at the table with them. The Pharisees and their scribes were complaining to his disciples, saying, "Why do you eat and drink with tax collectors and sinners?" Jesus answered, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick; I have come to call not the righteous but sinners to repentance."
6.32-34	you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them.If you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. If you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners , to receive as much again.
7.29-30	(And all the people who heard this, including the tax collectors, acknowledged the justice of God, because they had been baptized with John's baptism. But by refusing to be baptized by him, the Pharisees and the lawyers rejected God's purpose for themselves.)
7.34	the Human One has come eating and drinking, and you say, 'Look, a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners !'
7.37, 39	And <u>a woman in the city, who was a</u> sinner , having learned that he was eating in the Pharisee 's house, brought an alabaster jar of ointmentNow when the Pharisee who had invited him saw it, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would have known who and <u>what kind of woman this is who is touching himthat she is a sinner."</u>
13.2-3	He asked them, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse sinners than all other Galileans? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did.
15.1-2	Now all the tax collectors and sinners were <u>coming near to listen to him</u> . And the Pharisees <u>and the scribes were grumbling</u> and saying, "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them."
18.10-14	"Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector . The Pharisee , standing by himself, was praying thus, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector . I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income.' But the tax collector , standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner !' I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted."
