### USES OF BREPHOS, "INFANT" OR "BABY"

1.44	For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the <b>child</b> in my womb leaped for joy.
2.12, 16	This will be a sign for you: you will find a <b>child</b> wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the <b>child</b> lying in the manger.
18.15	People were bringing even <b>infants</b> to him that he might touch them; and when the disciples saw it, they sternly ordered them not to do it.

## USES OF PIADION, "INFANT" OR "CHILD"

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1.59	On the eighth day they came to circumcise the <b>child</b>
1.66	All who heard them pondered them and said, "What then will this <b>child</b> become?"
1.76	And you, <b>child</b> , will be called the prophet of the Most High
1.80	The <b>child</b> grew and became strong in spirit
2.17	When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this <b>child</b>

2.40	The <b>child</b> grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.

7.7	But only speak the word, and let my <b>servant</b> be healed.
8.51	except Peter, John, and James, and the <b>child's</b> father and mother.
8.54	But he took her by the hand and called out, "Child, get up!"
9.42	Jesus rebuked the unclean spirit, healed the <b>boy</b> , and gave him back to his father.

15.26	He called one of the <b>slaves</b> and asked what was going on.
