41.2	Who has <u>roused a victor from the</u> <b>east</b> , summoned him to his service? He delivers up nations to him, and tramples kings under foot; he makes them like dust with his sword, like driven stubble with his bow.
46.10b- 11	"My purpose shall stand, and I will fulfill my intention," <u>calling a bird of prey from the <b>east</b>, the man for my purpose from a far country</u> . I have spoken, and I will bring it to pass; I have planned, and I will do it.
