Genesis 28.10-31.55: Structure and Themes

OVERALL CHIASM

A: 28.10-29.12: Jacob on his way to Haran; dream encounter with YHWH at Bethel; meeting Rachel

B: 29.13-30: Jacob and Laban: "serving" for wives

C: 29.31-30.24: Rachel and Leah (see also Deut 21.15-17)

29.31-35: YHWH "sees" Leah and "opens" her womb: Leah's four sons 30.1-8: Jacob/Rachel: Rachel's two sons through Bilhah 30.9-13: Leah's two sons through Zilpah 30.14-21: Leah/Rachel: Leah's two sons and daughter 30.22-24: God "remembers" Rachel and "opens" her womb: Rachel's son

B1: 30.25-31.2: Jacob and Laban: "serving" for wives

A1: 31.3-18: Jacob leaves Haran, dream encounter with God of Bethel; meeting with Rachel (and Leah)

CHIASM, 31.19-30

A: 19: Rachel steals Laban's "household gods" (teraphim)

B: 20-23: Jacob deceives Laban in not telling him he intended to flee; pursuit into hill country of Gilead

C: 24: God speaks to Laban in dream

B1: 25-28: In hill country in Gilead, Laban accuses Jacob of deceiving him in fleeing secretly

Al: 29-30: Laban accuses Jacob of stealing his household gods (teraphim)

CHIASM, 31.19-55

A: 19-25: Jacob flees and Laban pursues

B: 26-30: Laban accuses Jacob

C: 31-35: the search for the *teraphim*

B1: 36-42: Jacob accuses Laban

A1: 43-55: Jacob and Laban make a covenant of shalom

STONE THEME: Outside these chapters, Hebrew for "stone" ('even) only at 2.12; 11.3; 35.14; 49.24; in these chapters, 12 times, as follows:

28.11: He came to a certain place and stayed there for the night, because the sun had set. *Taking one of the stones of the place*, he put it under his head and lay down in that place.

28.18: So Jacob rose early in the morning, and he took the stone that he had put under his head and set it up for a pillar and poured oil on the top of it.

28.22: ...this stone, which I have set up for a pillar, shall be God's house

29.2-3: The stone on the well's mouth was large, and when all the flocks were gathered there, the shepherds would roll the stone from the mouth of the well, and water the sheep, and put the stone back in its place on the mouth of the well.

29.8: But they said, "We cannot until all the flocks are gathered together, and the stone is rolled from the mouth of the well; then we water the sheep."

29.10: Jacob went up and rolled the stone from the well's mouth, and watered the flock of his mother's brother Laban.

31.45-46: So Jacob took a stone, and set it up as a pillar. And Jacob said to his kinsfolk, "Gather stones," and they took stones, and made a heap; and they ate there by the heap.
