- 3. Lodging with foreigners vs. kin
- 4. Rachel's beauty seen by Jacob; Sarah's/Rebekah's beauty seen by the ruler
- 5. Full sisters of each other vs. half-sister of Abraham
- 6. Patriarchs deceive ruler vs. "ruler" deceiving patriarch
- 7. Patriarchs given wealth vs. Jacob working for wealth
- 8. Wife given back vs. second wife given
- 9. Public departure vs. stealthy departure
