Jacob's "place" (Hebrew, <i>maqom</i>) naming in Genesis	
28.19	He called that place Bethel; but the name of the city was Luz at the first.
32.1-2	Jacob went on his way and the angels of God met him; and when Jacob saw them he said, "This is God's camp!" So he called that place Ma- hanaim.
32.30	So Jacob called the place Peniel , saying, "For I have seen God face to face, and yet my life is preserved."
33.17	But Jacob journeyed to Succoth, and built himself a house, and made booths for his cattle; therefore the place is called Succoth .
35.6-7	Jacob came to Luz (that is, Bethel), which is in the land of Canaan, he and all the people who were with him, and there he built an altar and called the place El-bethel , because it was there that God had revealed himself to him when he fled from his brother.
35.13-15	Then God went up from him at the place where he had spoken with him. Jacob set up a pillar in the place where he had spoken with him, a pillar of stone; and he poured out a drink offering on it, and poured oil on it. So Ja- cob called the place where God had spoken with him Bethel .
