

## Jacob's "place" (Hebrew, *maqom*) naming in Genesis

28.19	<b>He called that place Bethel</b> ; but the name of the city was Luz at the first.
32.1-2	Jacob went on his way and the angels of God met him; and when Jacob saw them he said, "This is God's camp!" <b>So he called that place Mahanaim.</b>
32.30	<b>So Jacob called the place Peniel</b> , saying, "For I have seen God face to face, and yet my life is preserved."
33.17	But Jacob journeyed to Succoth, and built himself a house, and made booths for his cattle; therefore <b>the place is called Succoth.</b>
35.6-7	Jacob came to Luz (that is, Bethel), which is in the land of Canaan, he and all the people who were with him, and there he built an altar and <b>called the place El-bethel</b> , because it was there that God had revealed himself to him when he fled from his brother.
35.13-15	Then God went up from him at the place where he had spoken with him. Jacob set up a pillar in the place where he had spoken with him, a pillar of stone; and he poured out a drink offering on it, and poured oil on it. So <b>Jacob called the place where God had spoken with him Bethel.</b>
