## Jesus as "the Lord" in Luke

7.13	When <b>the lord</b> <u>saw her, he had compassion for her</u> and said to her, "Do not weep."
7.18b- 19	So <u>John</u> summoned <u>two of his disciples and sent them to</u> <b>the lord</b> <u>to ask</u> , "Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?"
10.1	After this <b>the lord</b> appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go.
10.41	But <b>the lord</b> <u>answered her, "Martha, Martha,</u> you are worried and distracted by many things"
11.39	Then <b>the lord</b> <u>said to him, "Now you Pharisees</u> clean the outside of the cup and of the dish, but inside you are full of greed and wickedness."
12.42	And <b>the lord</b> <u>said</u> , "Who then is the faithful and prudent manager whom his master will put in charge of his slaves, to give them their allowance of food at the proper time?"
13.15	But <b>the lord</b> <u>answered him and said, "You hypocrites</u> ! Does not each of you on the sabbath untie his ox or his donkey from the manger, and lead it away to give it water?"
17.5-6	The <u>apostles</u> said to <b>the lord</b> , " <u>Increase our faith!"</u> <b>The lord</b> replied, " <u>If you had faith the size of a mustard seed</u> , you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you.
18.6	And <b>the lord</b> said, " <u>Listen to what the unjust judge says</u> ."
19.8	Zacchaeus stood there and said to the lord, "Look, half of my possessions, Lord, I will give to the poor; and if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I will pay back four times as much."
19.31	If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' just say this, ' <b>The lord</b> <u>needs it.'</u> "
22.61	The lord <u>turned and looked at Peter</u> . Then Peter remembered the word of <b>the lord</b> , how he had said to him, "Before the cock crows today, you will deny me three times."
24.34	<u>They were saying</u> , " <b>The lord</b> <u>has risen indeed</u> , and he has appeared to Simon!"
