## Luke 19.1-10: keyword/shape

He entered Jericho and was **passing through** [dierchomai] it. And behold! [idou] a man [anēr] was there named Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax collector and was rich. He was seeking [zēteō] to see who Jesus was, but on account of the crowd he could not, because he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a syca-more tree [sukomorea] to see him, because he was going to pass that way [dierchomai]. When Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry [speudō] and come down; for I must stay at your house [oikos] today." So he hurried [speudō] down and was happy to welcome him. All who saw it began to grumble and said, "He has gone to be the guest of a man [anēr] who is a sinner." Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord [kurios], "Behold [idou], half of my possessions, Lord [kurios], I will give to the poor; and if I have defrauded [su-kophonteō] anyone of anything, I will pay back four times as much." Then Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house [oikos], because he too is a son of Abraham. For the Human One came to seek out [zēteō] and to save the lost."
