

Luke 19.1-10: keyword/shape

He entered Jericho and was **passing through** [*dierchomai*] it. **And behold!** [*idou*] **a man** [*anēr*] was there named **Zacchaeus**; he was a chief tax collector and was rich. **He was seeking** [*zēteō*] to see who Jesus was, but on account of the crowd he could not, because he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed **a sycamore tree** [*sukomorea*] to see him, because he was going **to pass that way** [*dierchomai*]. When Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "**Zacchaeus, hurry** [*speudō*] and come down; for I must stay at your **house** [*oikos*] **today**." So **he hurried** [*speudō*] down and was happy to welcome him. All who saw it began to grumble and said, "He has gone to be the guest of **a man** [*anēr*] who is a sinner." **Zacchaeus** stood there and said to the **Lord** [*kurios*], "**Behold** [*idou*], half of my possessions, **Lord** [*kurios*], I will give to the poor; and if **I have defrauded** [*su-kophonteō*] anyone of anything, I will pay back four times as much." Then Jesus said to him, "**Today** salvation has come to this **house** [*oikos*], because he too is a son of Abraham. For the Human One came **to seek out** [*zēteō*] and to save the lost."
