Jacob's argument to Laban in Genesis 31.36-42

- 1. Show me the supposedly stolen items! (hence, not a thief)
- 2. I've cared well for all your flock (hence, a worthy worker/son-in-law)
- 3. I bore the loss of wounded/killed animals myself (hence, care beyond normal standards)
- 4. I experienced heat and cold and lack of sleep for all these years (hence, my suffering is worthy of reward)
- 5. I have kept my part of the bargain in working for you: 14 years for your daughters and six years for your animals (hence, earned my wages)
- 6. But you have cheated me ten times (hence, I am justified in not trusting you and leaving secretly)
- 7. God has protected me and rebuked you (hence, resolved the dispute by providing justice)
