Some scholarly questions about the parable of the vineyard/tenants

- 1. What words are from Jesus and what from the evangelist?
- 2. What is the relationship between Luke's version and Mark's (or *Gospel of Thomas*)?
- 3. What is the relationship between the parable (20.9-15a) and the interpretation (20.15b-19)?
- 4. Is the story a "parable" or an "allegory"?
- 5. Is the story "realistic" in relation to the socioeconomic context of Luke's audience?
- 6. What is the relationship between the story and Isaiah 5.1-7?
- 7. If read allegorically, what do the elements (vineyard, servants, lord of the vineyard, son, "others") represent?
